Program Notes

A passacaglia is a Baroque form in which variations are constructed above a repeated stately bass line in triple preter. Here, the measured variations of the first part are balanced by a more lively conclusion.

Notes to the Conductor

Here is an ideal way to introduce young string players to simple, yet endlessly fascinating, Baroque variation technique. Above a stately bass line appears a series of contrasting textures, each requiring a different bowing technique. And at the end, there is a quick romp, itself also a variation! Make sure your players observe the dynamic, as well as stylistic contrasts as the piece unfolds. The section that begins at m. 27 is *detaché* while the section that begins at m. 43 in the upper strings is *spiccato*. Let them enjoy the tag endings on the second beats of the allegro at bar 91.
