The Still Small Voice – When God spoke to Elijah on Mount Horeb, He could have done so in the wind, earthquake, or fire. But He didn't. Instead, He spoke with a "still small voice" (1 Kings 19:12). Psalm 46:10 reminds us to "be still, and know that He is God. This choral anthem by veterans Grace Hawthorne and Ken Medema reflects the quiet power of God's "still small voice." It is appropriate for use all year long and particularly effective in worship before or after prayer. Pay eareful attention to the dynamic contrasts, which serve to heighten the textual and musical sensitivities of the piece.

Grace Hawthorne – In addition to creating the book and lyrics for *It's Cool in the Furnace*, Grace Hawthorne has had a varied writing career that covers everything from writing ad copy for septic tanks to the libretto for an opera. She has also been a stand-up storyteller and produced several CDs including *The Gift*, a tribute to 9/11. Her first novel, *Shorter's Way*, received the 2014 Independent Publisher Award for best regional fiction. It is a political love story about rambunctious Georgia politics in the 1920s. She is currently working on a second book, *Waterproof Justice*. Her latest musical, *The Big Fish*, is a film-noir adaptation of the story of Jonah and the whale.

Ken Medema is a singer, keyboardist, and composer living in Alameda, California. He has been performing and writing since the early 1970s. He holds music degrees from Michigan State University and is a registered music therapist. His performance schedule takes him throughout the USA and to other countries around the globe.
