Surely He Has Borne Our Griefs—This poignant prophetic text from Isaiah 53 begins with the question, "Who has believed what we have heard, and to whom has the Lord been revealed?" The soloist then goes on to describe our Lord as a young plant, a root growing out of dry ground—Man of sorrows known to grief. It is important that the soloist allow the gravity of the words themselves to communicate, rather than add too much stylistic nuance, which might detract from Isaiah's poetic message.

A steady tempo at m. 22 prepares the choir for their first entrance at m. 23 with the signature words of this passage, "Surely He has borne our griefs . . ." The same applies in not over dramatizing the musical phrase, but allowing it to poignantly express the message, and continuing to the ending phrase, "by His wounds we are now made whole."

The contrasting middle section at m. 41 is set in a gentler tone and modality, confessing that we have all, like sheep, gone astray. Leading with a crescendo and modulation to the reprise at m. 51, the choir and accompanist may add more dynamic force to this now familiar phrase and melody, continuing to the final statement "by His wounds we are now made whole."

John Purifoy is an ASCAP composer of choral, orchestral, piano, and solo works. His compositions have been performed and recorded by actress/singer Carol Lawrence, the Anna Kerr Singers, UCLA Concert Choir, the Northwest Choral Society of Chicago, Georgetown University Concert Choir, Emory University Choirs, and other artists and performing groups around the world. He received a Bachelor of Music in Piano Performance from the University of Artlansas and completed graduate study in music theory at the University of Texas, (Chronicles of Blue and Gray," composed for chorus and orchestra and commissioned by the Knowville Choral Society, was premiered in 2012 to commemorate the sesquicentennial of the American Civil War. It received a New York Premiere at Carnegie Hall on June 8, 2014 by Distinguished Concerts International New York. His patriotic oratorio, "We Hold These Truths" narrated by author Alex Haley, won the 1989 Freedoms Foundation at Valley Forge award for musical programs, and he is a multi-recipient of the ASCAP Standard Award. Mr. Purifoy lives in Knoxville. Tennessee, with his wife, Vicki.
