Aspen Leaf Rag

The heart-shaped leaves of the aspen tree turn a vibrant shade of gold for only about a week during the month of September. It is difficult to predict where and when the leaves will turn. Those who go on color-seeking road trips should select their travel dates in advance and then go where the color is. Scenic drives located throughout the mountains of Colorado draw thousands of visitors to the state every autumn.

Moonlight on the Slopes

Colorado is home to dozens of ski areas, including some of the finest resorts in the world. The first skiers in the state were miners who used homemade, wooden skis to travel between camps. Pikes Peak Boogie

At an elevation of 14,115 feet above sea level, Pikes Peak towers over the city of Colorado Springs in central Colorado. In 1893, the view from this summit inspired Katherine Lee Bates to write about "spacious skies" and "purple mountain majesties" in her patriotic anthem "America the Beautiful." The trip to the top is much easier today thanks to the Pikes Peak Highway that allows visitors to drive to the summit.
