PROGRAM NOTES

After returning from his famous stay in London, where he was enthusiastically received by admiring audiences, Haydn wrote a number of small pieces for choir and piano. Often used for devotions in the household of Prince Esterházy, his patron and employer, *Abendlied zu Gott* is a gem of contrapuntal technique and a wonderful example of *Hausmusik*, intimate works for music-making at home.
