



ALFRED'S BASIC GUITAR METHOD 3

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The Doo-Wop Ballad



In the 1950s a style of rock and roll ballad called *doo-wop* became very popular. This type of song featured many long held notes sung over an accompaniment of triplets, played either as chords or arpeggios. Here are a few samples of each.

Key of C

CHORDS: C 3 Am 3 F G7 3

THE SAME CHORDS PLAYED AS ARPEGGIOS: C 3 Am 3 F 3 G7 3

ABIDE WITH ME (DUET) Track 47

This arrangement of the lovely old hymn combines a chord/melody solo in the 1st part with an arpeggio-style accompaniment in the 2nd part. The student should learn both parts. Also, note that the accompaniment is always played at a dynamic one level lower than the melody part.

The tempo indication *Lento* means to play slowly.
