


THE DOWN- and UP-STROKE

You can make your accompaniment of waltz songs like "The Streets of Laredo" more interesting by replacing the second beat of the measure with a down-stroke followed by an up-stroke. The symbol for down-stroke is □; an up-stroke is called for by the sign V. Together, the down- and up-stroke take as much time as a regular strum.
