About the Artist: Edward Middleton Manigault was born in London, Ontario, in 1887 to American parents from Charleston, South Carolina. He left home in 1905 to study art in New York City, and one of his works was displayed in the legendary New York Armory Show in 1913. During World War I, he served as an ambulance driver for the British expeditionary forces. Throughout his career, Manigault destroyed many of his paintings, and few survive. In 1919 he moved to California and began fasting, which he believed would enable him to "see colors not perceptible to the physical eye." He died in San Francisco in 1922.
