





















TAKE A BREAK

FELIX MENDELSSOHN ...

- Was a German composer who lived from 1809 to 1847.
- Began piano lessons at the age of six and wrote lots of music from a young age.
- Was a good artist he liked painting the beautiful places he'd visited in watercolours.
- Drew cartoons in letters to his friends.
- His music is in the Romantic style often expressing feelings and thoughts.

SONG WITHOUT WORDS OP.62 NO.6

- Is also known as 'Spring Song' and is one of Mendelssohn's most famous pieces.
- Has been very popular since it was first published.
