This scene in Act III takes place on the island of Crete in the year 1200 B. C. Ilia, daughter of Priam, King of Troy, is in love with Idamante, son of Idomeneo, King of Crete. Idomeneo, when returning with his ships from a victorious war, encountered violent storms, and promised to Neptune, the God of the Sea, any sacrifice for the safe arrival to his native Crete. Neptune demanded that the first person Idomeneo would meet upon landing be sacrificed to him. It happened to be his son, Idamante. While Idamante is about to be sacrificed, Ilia sings this aria.
