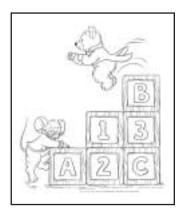

Part 1: Introduction and Review

Teacher	Children
1. Play <i>Hello Song</i> () to indicate the start of music class. (See page 17 for lyrics.)	Stand, sing and imitate teacher's movements.
• Demonstrate the movements in the lyrics: wave hello, clap hands, stamp feet, turn around, touch the ground.	
2. Ask: "What were the names of the music friends we met at our last class? They liked high and low sounds." [Mozart Mouse and Beethoven Bear]	2. Raise hands, answer question.
3. Using xylophone, demonstrate high and low sounds.	3. Sit, watch and listen.
4. After several examples, say: "Let's show Mozart Mouse and Beethoven Bear that we know high and low sounds. If the sounds are high, put your hands straight up in the air and whisper <i>Mozart Mouse</i> . If the sounds are low, put your hands in your lap and whisper <i>Beethoven Bear</i> ."	4. Listen to musical examples and respond appropriately.
 Play more examples on the xylophone. Match student movement for each example, by holding Mozart Mouse or Beethoven Bear in the correct position (high or low) to reinforce children's responses. 	
5. Show the Beethoven Bear and Mozart Mouse plush animals.	5. Stand, form a line.
 Say: "Beethoven Bear and Mozart Mouse are going to help us play Follow the Leader as we listen to the High and Low Song. Let's make a line." 	
• Give the Mozart Mouse plush animal to the leader at the front of the line to hold, and the Beethoven Bear plush animal to the leader at the end of the line.	
6. Say: "Now we're going to play Follow the Leader. When you hear the high parts of the song, follow Mozart Mouse. When you hear the low parts, turn and follow Beethoven Bear." [First section is HIGH and second section is LOW.]	6. Stand, follow the leader, listen for high and low.
• Play High and Low Song (\$\mathbb{3}\$)
